From the Chairman of the Parish Council

Annual Report

EAST WEST RAIL (EWR)

The EWR company report that people living in the towns and villages across the potential EWR Route, and their community representatives were extremely generous in their time and expertise during the 2021 Consultation, giving EWR a significant - and very welcome - challenge to see how and where we could change and improve East West Rail.

EWR received over 9,000 responses and, within these, over 160,000 individual matters were raised. All of these responses are being reviewed and considered by the expert team of consultants employed by EWR. The company maintains they have a duty to take all of this feedback into real consideration - which takes time - and will publish a report summarising the consultation feedback as well as information on how the feedback has been used to inform plans for the railway once they have completed that work. EWR claim to be pushing to develop the best possible design options based on this feedback alongside environmental, technical and financial studies.

It's not just a case of the total volume of feedback either. Among the thousands of comments and ideas the company received in the 2021 consultation, people asked EWR to re-think how embankments might impact the landscape, to minimise noise coming from a new railway through the use of silent rail and gave the company helpful detail about which rights of way really make a difference to people living in small communities. These are just a few examples of the detailed issues the EWR team is reviewing, assessing and evaluating in depth. This will enable EWR Co to provide individual responses to each matter as well as more general responses to any recurring themes.

Initially EWR had aimed to finish this work early in 2022, but it now believes it is more likely to be ready to publish in the summer of 2022. Communities will have further opportunities to comment on EWR proposals at a subsequent statutory consultation, following which it expects to submit a formal application for a Development Consent Order to the Secretary of State for permission to construct and operate EWR. Therefore, in brief;

- 2022 has seen the formation and operation of the EWR Stakeholder Group
- Report on responses to the previous 'informal consultation' is likely in the summer with the 'Formal / Statutory Consultation' now likely to be held in early 2023
- EWR appear to be reviewing the Business Case for the Central section (Bletchley to Cambridge) at the moment
- Future of the Oxford Cambridge Arc as a concept now in doubt as central government moves resources to levelling up elsewhere in the UK.
- Need for a single masterplan for the SEMK area including EWR/SEMK area and our local MP (lain Stewart) has asked the Housing Minister (Stewart Andrew MP) to 'call in' the SEMK area plan so that a single, unified plan can be produced in its place.

UKRAINE

SEMK

The Plan: MK, South East Milton Keynes Strategic Urban Extension (SEMK) allocation is located to the south of Milton Keynes on land adjacent to Wavendon, Walton, Woburn Sands and Bow Brickhill, straddling the East West Rail railway line. It is allocated for approximately 3,000 homes, associated uses, a secondary school, two primary schools, Gypsy and Travellers site and other supporting social and green infrastructure.

The granting of planning permission for housing and other uses within the allocation is contingent on the preparation and adoption of a comprehensive Development Framework Supplementary Planning Document Following an iterative process of engagement and public consultation, an SPD for SEMK has been

produced for adoption. Once adopted, it would be a significant material consideration in determining applications within SEMK.

The decision, taken by Cllr Peter Marland (Leader of MK Council and Cabinet member for Strategic Planning) on 11 January 2022, confirmed that the Council believes phasing of the site should be West to East and, subsequent to the adoption of the SEMK SPD, would ensure best endeavours to engage with the relevant parties to establish appropriate principles for the phasing of the SEMK development and related infrastructure, and to explore opportunities to phase development of the site from West to East.

A SEMK Stakeholder Group consisting of representatives of local Town, Parish and Community Councils, has been established to monitor the development phases in detail and this has met on one occasion and is scheduled to meet next in June to consider the current formal planning application and again in July to consider another phase application from O&H Properties. A separate Delegated Decision was taken on 25 January (also by Cllr Marland) confirming future access links from SEMK onto Newport Road in Wavendon (and Bow Brickhill Road) with a local, weight restricted (limiting HGV vehicles to access only) and 30 MPH speed restricted link ensuring local traffic will be diverted away from Woburn Sands from both directions.

THE SEMK SPD PROPOSES:

- a residential-led mixed use development of approximately 3000 homes;
- two education sites providing a total of seven forms of entry for secondary education and six forms of entry for primary education and early years provision;
- two local centres, one of which will include a community reserve site;
- a primary option and a reserve option for the strategic movement network as part of a comprehensive network of transport infrastructure which promote active modes of travel, enable public transport to service the development, enable a future fast mass-transit system connection, and consider potential future railway crossings;

- a location for seven permanent pitches for Gypsies and Travellers;
- a comprehensive network of footpaths and cycleways, extending the Milton Redway network into the site and ensuring good connectivity to adjoining communities of Woburn Sands, Wavendon and Bow Brickhill; and a network of green infrastructure with indicated location for associated strategic sustainable drainage systems and open spaces through the site that connects to areas beyond it.

So, in summary:

- The SPD / Masterplan was agreed by MKC in January
- A SEMK Stakeholder Group made up of representatives of local town, parish and community councils has been formed
- Application has been received by MK Council from developer/agents and another expected in the near future
- Responses to the Outline Planning Application submitted by L & Q Estates and Fox Land & Property, ref No 22/00524/OUTEIS - have been submitted by Wavendon PC and Woburn Sands Town Council. The Community of Woburn Sands Group (COWS) has produced a useful leaflet and draft response to this application, (see elsewhere in this edition of Wafas)

MARSHALLS OF CAMBRIDGE

Marshall is bringing forward proposals to relocate its global Aerospace headquarters and operations to Cranfield Airport. In May 2019, Marshalls announced its intention to relocate its Aerospace business from Cambridge, as part of its commitment to invest in the long-term future of this unique, private company.

In doing so, Marshall Aerospace will vacate the existing Cambridge Airport site making it available for a mixed-use redevelopment known as Cambridge East to further build on Cambridge's incredible success as a centre for world leading academia, research, technology and life sciences.

Marshalls are committed to creating an extraordinary future for its business and our communities, both in Cambridge and at Cranfield.

The Aerospace business will employ up to 1,200 people at Cranfield, many of whom will be involved in the hands-on maintenance of the aircraft, whilst the others will cover a wide range of support roles, providing a diverse mix of career opportunities.

The next key stage in its forward planning is to seek outline planning permission for the proposed development, prior to us making a final commitment to move.

Subject to planning permissions and viability, Marshalls would expect to start construction in 2024 with operations coming online between 2027 to 2030 to ensure continuity of service for its customers

So, in brief:

- Relocation from Cambridge to Cranfield bringing 1200 jobs
- Likely limited to one flight of Hercules or similar aircraft associated with this development in or out per day

COWS

Local residents have formed The Community of Woburn Sands and the surrounding area (COWS) resident's group, meeting monthly in Woburn Sands. The group has focused initially on monitoring SEMK, EWR as well as issues in the neighbouring Central Bedfordshire area and (for example) the construction of the warehousing in Bow Brickhill and the knock-on impacts of road closures and diversions. COWS also attend the monthly Saturday market in Woburn Sands and provide a useful additional scrutiny function and interface with the community.

MK UNIVERSITY

Disappointingly, the government has not funded the core aspects of the proposed university for MK so the Milton Keynes council is considering how best to take this forward in conjunction with the project lead from Cranfield University.

GREENSAND TRUST

The Greensand Trust is the body that oversees the maintenance and enhancement of the Greensand Ridge which runs from Leighton Buzzard to

Gamlingay and includes the Brickhills and Woburn Sands. The 2022 Greensand Country Festival is currently underway and many people locally have started planning events. The 2022 Festival will

run throughout the month of May and will also continue into June as school half-term runs from Monday 30th May to Sunday 5th June.



As with last year's Festival the organisers are promoting both live and virtual events.

COACH TRIPS

THE NEW PAVILION (WAVENDON HUB) OFF DANKWORTH WAY AND STOCKWELL LANE

Good progress is being made on the construction of the building with a view to a handover to the Wavendon Parish Council in late June 2022. There have been some limited delays in the setting of the pitches, but it is anticipated that (given good weather this summer) they will most likely be playable from Spring 2023

Thanks to - David Ostler who has recently stood down from the Parish Council. David has been active in his reporting of planning and other issues in the Cross End area of the Parish and is a keen supporter of our environmental, tree planting and climate change initiatives.

The Parish Clerk will be advertising for this vacancy and, of course, the Parish Council will likely be coopting to fill the vacancies that have arisen for the expanded membership of the council as we grow from 7 to 9 councillors.

Bee Alert

May Day Bank Holiday saw the arrival of thousands of visitors to Wavendon. A resident spotted a swarm of honeybees on the Walton Road church wall.

The risk of the bees being damaged by a passing vehicle, or pedestrians stung if the bees were disturbed meant that action was needed. A visit to The British Beekeepers Association website bbka.org.uk quickly identified our swarm to be honeybees.... small and brown in colour with large hairy eyes, a fury chest and bent antennae. The next step was to find a local swarm collector. This identified Colin Bowker in Middleton. A guick text and phone chat with Colin meant he was on site within minutes (see pic). He skilfully and patiently was able to capture the entire swarm safely, and they are now housed in one of his hives, safe and ready to perform their vital role.

Approximately 35 Wavendon Residents came together (spade in hand) to plant a micro forest of 500 trees on the new Wavendon Heights Pavilion field off Stockwell Lane on 8 April.

The trees have been planted as part of the unique tree planting initiative created to mark Her Majesty's Platinum Jubilee in 2022 which invites people from across the United Kingdom to "Plant a Tree for the Jubilee". It will form part of a residents garden and leisure area which is being transferred to the ownership of the Parish from MK Council later in 2022 that also includes the new Pavilion/meeting place and playing fields, mainly laid out for use as soccer pitches.

Marshall Aerospace proposed move to Cranfield

Marshall is bringing forward proposals to relocate its global Aerospace headquarters and operations from Cambridge to Cranfield Airport and many local people attended the two day public consultation.

Marshall Aerospace specialises in the routine Maintenance, Repair and Overhaul (MRO), conversion and modification of military aircraft, predominantly the iconic C-130 Hercules transport aircraft and the new site would see over 1200 jobs transferring or created in Cranfield.

Marshall selected Cranfield as it has:

- A runway capable of accommodating our customers' aircraft
- Sufficient proximity to Cambridge that it is a viable location for a significant number of our existina workforce
- Space for the construction of our facilities close to the runway
- A willing landowner and partner (in Cranfield) University)
- A well-established labour market and local skills base aligned to advanced manufacturing

Marshall will be submitting a formal application to Central Beds Council in the summer and, if permissions are granted, the transfer is likely to be completed by the end of the decade. It is anticipated that a maximum of one flight a day in and/or out of the airport would be the likely flight movements of the Hercules aircraft although Marshall would have permission for up to 1500 per annum.

REJECT SPECULATIVE PLANS THAT WILL DESTROY OUR COMMUNITIES

Have your say in shaping the future of our villages

Two developers have submitted plans to MK Council for SEMK between Wavendon, Woburn Sands and Bow Brickhill. Their application ignores MK Council guidance and will devastate our communities.

This is our opportunity to reject it.

REASONS TO REJECT THE PLANNING APPLICATION:

- 1. Consultation process: Developers have provided no meaningful consultation with local residents.
- 2. Developers have ignored local community plans: The developers' planning application ignores MK Council guidance (SPD) designed to ensure all development is done in the right way. The developers' plans are not consistent with the needs of our communities. For example, the plans deny Woburn Sands proposed new playing fields. They also do not take account of East West Rail proposals.
- 3. Proposed housing will be densest in MK: The developers are planning housing that is not in keeping with surrounding villages or MK plans. The planned housing will have greater density than in Broughton.
- 4. Lack of transport planning: The developer's plans do not address the new traffic that will be created. Without new routes into MK, traffic could be funnelled onto the Bow Brickhill Road and into our villages.
- 5. Failure to coordinate with East West Rail could lead to years of chaos: No plan should be approved until EWR's plans have been published. A coordinated planning process is needed to avoid daily traffic gridlock and inadequate amenities.

I hope you have been enjoying the Spring weather and taking advantage of the longer days. I wanted to take this opportunity to update you with what I have been doing in the constituency over the last month.

I had the opportunity to go for a walk with Matthew Barber, Thames Valley Police and Crime Commissioner, and some Milton Keynes police officers through Ashland, Netherfield and Beanhill. It was an opportunity to discuss the recruitment of police officers, the plans to reduce serious violence, neighbourhood policing and plans to tackle knife crime. This comes after I recently wrote to the Home Secretary, Priti Patel, inviting her to come to Milton Keynes to discuss knife crime. I will continue to work with Thames Valley Police to make Milton Keynes a safer place for all!

I visited the site of the new Winslow Train Station on the East West Rail line. The visit was an opportunity to have an update on the work of the East West Rail between Bletchley and Bicester. I was pleased to hear of the great progress that is being made in the construction of the line between Oxford and Cambridge, passing through Bletchley. I also learned of the barriers being installed along the line that will absorb the noise and vibrations from the train, minimising the impact on local residents.

Also, I visited Bletchley Park to plant a tree to be part of The Queen's Green Canopy with lain Standen, Chief Executive Officer at Bletchley Park. The tree can be found on the bank of the lake overlooking the Mansion. It was also an opportunity to have a discussion about Bletchley

Park and have an update on the work that is going on. I was excited to learn of the new exhibitions that are on their way to the museum in the next month. Did you know that Bletchley Park are still running their local resident offer, giving Milton Keynes residents 50% off ticket prices and free return within the year?

Another visit was to First Avenue Supplies Ltd in Bletchley. First Avenue Supplies are an embroidery and printing company in Milton Keynes offering work on a wide range of goods, mainly workwear and PPE. I met with Ian Temple to have a tour of their facility and a demonstration of their embroidery and printing process. I was pleased to hear about the huge demand for their services, from a range of organisations including Aston Martin and Bill's Coach Hire.



Roadworks in the Summer -Walton Road. Wavendon (Road closure)

Please be advised that road improvement works will be commencing at Walton Road in Wavendon at the **Junction of Kinas** Close.



The works are being carried out by Mullen Groundworks on behalf of Abbey Developments Limited as part of a Section 278 highways agreement related to its planning permission(s).

The programme has a start date of 6th July 2022 - 19th July 2022 between 0930-1630 each day.

Works will include the resurfacing of the outside of the development carriageway for approximately 70m. Installation of two uncontrolled pedestrian crossings on the opposite side of the road. Upgrade of existing street light lanterns to LED and gully cleansing. Due to the limited space on the carriageway and being unable to maintain traffic flow safely through the works these works are required to be carried out under a road closure. The diversion route will be signed to divert all traffic via Newport Road / Groveway / Tongwell Street as per the traffic management plan and all traffic should follow the diversion route. Pedestrian access will be maintained.

Advanced notice signs will placed on site to advise that there are works planned between the dates above and delays are likely.
